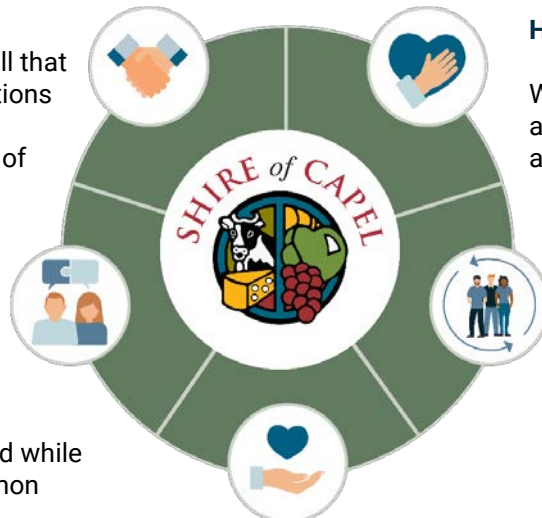

5. PRESENTATIONS

5.1 Lucy Sheehy – Coast WA Local Government Facilitator – WALGA

A follow-up to a couple questions during the presentation has been provided by Lucy Sheehy:

The *Assessment of Coastal Erosion Hotspots Report* is available [here](#). The link includes a number of different pdfs. Section 3.1.2 (p23 of the main report) gives some details of the nature of watchlist locations. The watchlist locations and extents are provided in Appendix B.

Hotspot locations are areas that are likely to experience impacts and require management within 25 years. Based on the hazard maps at Dalyellup, impacts are likely to happen in a later timeframe. Possibly the reason South Forrest Beach is included as a watchlist location could be because they thought the road there may be impacted within the 25 year timeframe.

There will be a major review of the Hotspots Report in a couple of years' time and that will be informed by Local Government coastal hazard mapping. When the existing report was completed, there was very little coastal hazard mapping available.

[Track Care WA](#) is an organisation which works towards safe and responsible off-road driving in WA through their Code of Road Program. They can partner with Local Government to develop local Code off Road brochures ([see City of Albany one](#)) and they have held community education events etc..

Some examples of recent Coastwest funded projects to address impact of 4WDs on beaches include:

- Shire of Waroona received funding for the Preston Beach Volunteer Rangers to undertake brushing of dunes at Preston Beach to rehabilitate blowouts etc. Preston Beach Volunteer Rangers also undertake regular patrols, monitoring of the dunes, education of 4WD users etc. They received \$14,960 in 2022-23 and have also received funding in previous years.
- Shire of Esperance (in partnership with the Esperance Tjaltjraak Native Title Aboriginal Corporation) received funding for the closure (fencing/bollards) and planting/brushing/rehabilitation of 4WD tracks. They received \$44,580 in 2022-23.
